Having an Impact

The Education Endowment Foundation published their Children's University Evaluation Report at the beginning of this year. This report is the result of an independent evaluation over two years from schools across Lancashire by a team from Durham University with funding from EEF and the Cabinet Office. Summary of their findings include -

- Children in CU schools made two additional months' progress in reading and maths compared to children in other schools.
- · Children were more likely to select professional occupations as their future aspiration, and to report higher levels of communication, empathy, self-confidence, resilience, and happiness, after the intervention.

We would like to say a massive thank you to the 50 schools across Lancashire who contributed to this study. We are thrilled to see this fantastic impact measurement that highlights just how beneficial Children's University is to your students and your school.


