

POLITE URGENT REQUEST!

Dinner Money and Letters: Please can you send dinner money in a named envelope and ask your child to hand it directly to his/her class teacher. Whilst we know you may be concerned about your child forgetting to hand it in, we do have a box system in each class. This sends all necessary information straight to the office in the morning. If you simply label the sealed envelope. Mrs. Beech will then process each payment. This system prevents heavy queues at the office and ensures urgent messages can be dealt with promptly. Many thanks to everyone who now use this system.

Breakfast Club

Our breakfast club opens at 8.30am every day. Children must arrive no later than 8.50am, giving them sufficient time to eat their breakfast. If you would like your child to attend, you must register first with Mrs. Beech in the office for a fee of £5.00 per family per year. Thereafter, the cost is only £1.00 per child per day; this includes two items for breakfast. Children not attending breakfast club must only arrive after 8.50am and stay on the yard. Other than ordering a lunch from 8.50am in the hall and those attending breakfast club, no child should be in the building before 9am. This is for health and safety reasons to ensure the safety of all our children.

School Dinners Welcome to a new school year from the kitchen staff, Wendy and Helen. We are here to help so if your child has dietary requirements we will do our best to accommodate them. All food is nutritious and healthy. We also have regular 'Favourite Fridays' where all children are welcome to try out our dinners. The cost of a dinner is £2.20 per day or £11.00 per week. A snack club is also available at morning break time serving a variety of foods e.g. toast 20p, teacakes 30p etc.

Uniform

All the children returned to school looking extremely smart, so a very big thank you to all parents.

During this half term, KS2 (Years 3 to 6) have the choice of wearing either a white polo shirt or a cotton shirt and tie. KSI children will wear a white polo shirt without a tie.

Please note that after half term children in KS2 will wear a white cotton shirt with a school tie (school ties are available at the office. Please see Mrs. Beech if you need any help). Children in Reception, Year I and 2 only wear a white polo shirt as opposed to a shirt and tie as it saves valuable time whilst changing for P.E.
