Over the last few months you will have seen many contractors on site carrying out a number of projects that the Governing Body of St. Joseph's have planned for. The glass on interior windows and doors has now all been replaced with fire safety glazing and freshened up with new paintwork. School has been fitted with a number of new uPVC windows and metal doors which provides extra security and insulation. The cladding around the outside of school has been replaced with log lasting uPVC cladding. The final phase of the flat roof has been replaced and completed. Most of these projects have been the result of successful bids to Lancashire County Council, working alongside Leeds Diocese.
